RETREAT SUPPLY CHECKLIST- What do I need to bring to Retreat?

Personal Checklist:

	Bedding & pillow (sleeping bag or sheets & blanket for a twin bed; this is not a hotel – think summer camp)
	Quilts to decorate your bed and/or walls of your room if you wish
	Bathroom items: towels, washcloth, toiletries, hair dryer etc.
	Any medications you'll need
	Clothing (layers are best, as temperatures can change quickly), pajamas, etc.
	Outdoor & hiking gear (optional; Wallace Falls is next to Camp Huston)
	Rain gear! This is the Pacific Northwest after all.
	Snacks to hold you over between meals, and to share with friends. Wine is allowed, but only in the cabins.
	Your own coffee mug and wine glass, if you'd like.
	If you'd like to listen to music, please bring headphones, as playing music out loud is not allowed.
	Camera, cell phone, and their chargers
	Flashlight and/or nightlight (the overhead lights with fans are really loud)
	Earplugs (if you are a light sleeper)
	Cash or checks (buy fabric, garage sale items, massages, scissor sharpening, and raffle tickets)
	Tools and/or scissors you'd like sharpened (if the sharpener guy is going to be there)
Sewing Supplies Checklist:	
	Projects (everything you need, including pattern, fabrics, and batting. Think ahead – you might find yourself piecing, basting, and/or quilting. You might want to have practice fabric on hand to learn a new technique from another quilter).
	Sewing machine (don't forget your accessories and attachments! Did you pack your foot pedal & power cord?)
	Power strips, extension cords, light for your work space (extra lightbulb?)
	Your own chair (optional) and/or a few chair pads. You want to be comfortable! Camp Huston does
	have a supply of chair pads.
	Masking tape for decorations and to keep cords stationary across the floor
	Basic sewing supplies (thread, needles, pins, iron & ironing board, rotary cutter and extra blades, mat,
	rulers, and other items you keep near your sewing area at home)
	Scissors (and knives or gardening tools) if you want to get them sharpened at retreat
	Batting or flannel for a design wall.
	Fabric and other items to sell or put on the "free" table.
	Fat quarters to put in the FQ raffle basket – winner takes all! One FQ = one ticket.

Label everything with your name! Amazingly, everyone's stuff looks like everyone else's stuff after four days of sewing!
